Albury is an Australian city, located in southern New South Wales.

Situated on the border of Victoria, this city hugs Australia's longest and most iconic river. The Murray River starts as a trickle before swelling into the broad, snaking boundary between Victoria and New South Wales.

We have installed 19 water stations, to date across the City of Albury, as part of our ongoing improvements in Parks and Recreation spaces. We chose to work with Meet PAT for the supply and installation for two main reasons. Firstly, they are a locally based company here in Albury. A huge plus, allowing us to have direct contact with the business, visit the manufacturing facilities and meet with the staff. This gave us confidence with the products and service they were offering.

# Wagirra Trail and Yindyamarra Sculpture Walk

# Smart Infrastructure

With two border cities working as one, the Albury and Wodonga's Smart Community Framework was created. In collaboration with a broad range of community stakeholders, this provides a blueprint that will guide the planning and delivery of smart and connected community services across the region.

Meet PAT water stations are contributing to the smart network, by deploying 3 public LoRaWAN gateways. This will assist in connecting AlburyCity Council water stations to an online platform.



## A telling story

Applying individual graphics to the water stations, has maximized the community engagement of each product. AlburyCity Council displays amazing stories and imagery of local heritage, through to modern culture.

Using sympathetic branding to inspire and educate, whilst providing an amazing infrastructure piece for the entire community.



Haberfields began in 1931 as a milk delivery run by Jock Haberfield and Annie Gray. After they married in 1932, they built a pasteurising plant and dairy across the road from this site. Jock later said: "People were reluctant to accept pasteurised milk. They wanted hot milk straight from the cow, not cold milk in bottles!" Through the Great Depression, World War II, price wars and many changes in production, Haberfield not only kept local people healthy but were successful in the regional, national, and overseas markets until bought by Parmalat in 1996. Jock and Annie Haberfield set very high standards. Their advertising slogan from the 1930's perhaps sums this up best: "You can whip our cream, but you can't beat our milk".

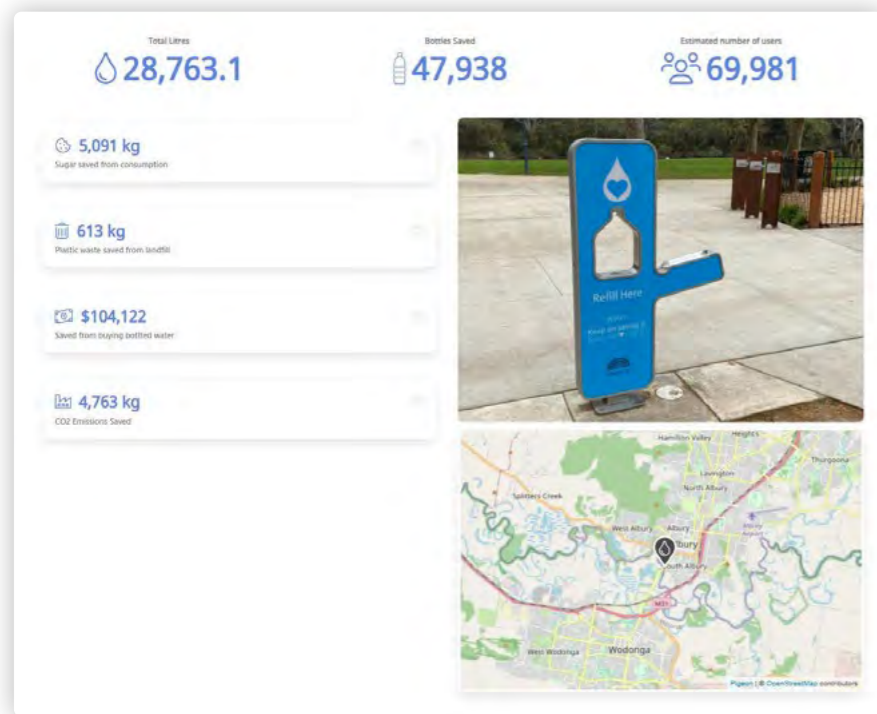

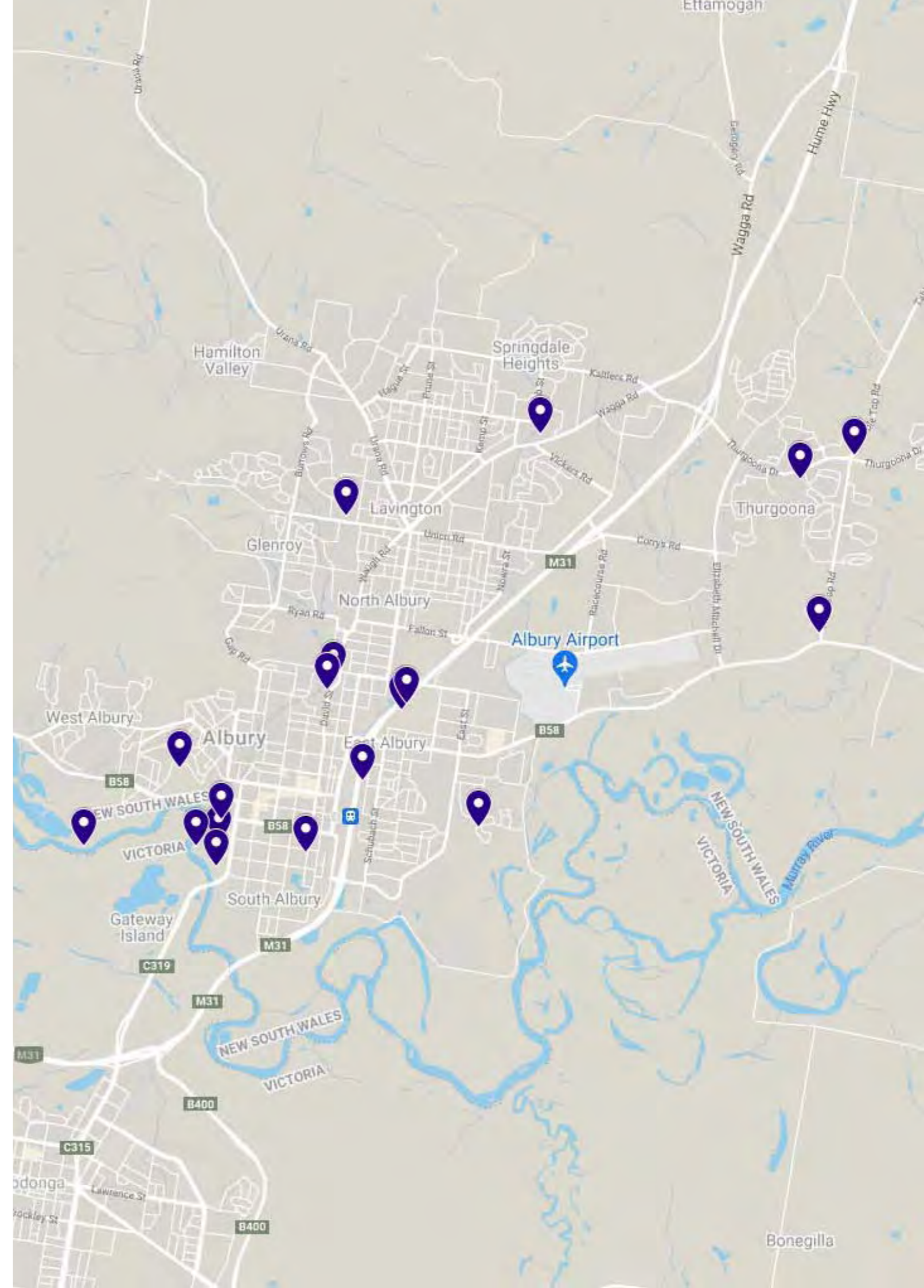
# How do we know?

These sensors can provide live data, which is linked and captured by our online proprietary data management system.



LoRaWAN™ is a long range, low-power wireless network. This technology is all about connecting a product such as a water station to the Internet easily.
